Its Simple!

All you have to do is:

1. Take an envelope from one of our many dispensers located throughout the campus and community
2. Place your empty printer cartridge inside the envelope
3. Remove the white tape with the red letters, fold down the flap. and seal the envelope.
4. If you wish, you may write your return address in the upper left hand corner of the front of the envelope
5. Just put it in a mailbox. You don't even need a stamp!

See! Wasn't that easy?!



Use **all** of your ink in the Cartridge. Make sure its empty



Remove Cartridge from printer



Find one of our conveniently located envelope dispensers



Take an envelope or two for your empty cartridge



Put your empty cartridge in the envelope



Remove the tape and seal the envelope.



Write your return address on the envelope



Put it in the mailbox and send it away

SIMPLE WAYS TO SAVE RESOURCES

- *Take your own bag to the Grocery or Bookstore. If you must use a bag please choose plastic instead of paper and re-use it.*
- *Use mugs or insulated cups instead of disposable foam or paper cups.*
- *Shut the water off when brushing teeth, washing your face, or shaving. It could save up to 9 gallons every time.*
- *Make sure all lights and electronics are turned off when not in use.*
- *Wash clothes in a cold water setting. It uses 90% less energy and does the same job.*
