



NIH Minority Access to Research Careers Fellowship Application

Application deadline: July 1, 2011

The goals of the MARC program are to increase the number of Ph.D. scientists from underrepresented minority groups who are engaged in biomedical research and to prepare them for research careers. These minority groups traditionally include African Americans, Latin/Hispanic Americans, Alaska or Native Americans with tribal affiliation, and natives of the U.S. Pacific Islands (Guam, Samoa, Hawaii, etc.).

Eligibility: Full-time sophomore or junior Stony Brook undergraduate from an underrepresented group.

Complete applications include:

- ◆ A personal statement describing yourself, your career goals, your commitment to the goals of the MARC fellowship, and a description of your current or planned research project (2 pages max.)
- ◆ Two letters of recommendation from faculty (one letter should be from your research mentor)
- ◆ Non-Stony Brook transcripts (if any) – the MARC office will acquire your Stony Brook transcript
- ◆ Proof of citizenship or permanent residency (birth certificate or permanent resident card)
