

TOP 5 THINGS BUSINESS OWNERS CAN DO TO SECURE A SHUTTERED VENUE OPERATORS GRANT

The Shuttered Venue Operators Grant (SVOG) portal opens for applications on Thursday, April 8, 2021

#1 Determine Your Eligibility:

#2 - Review the SBA Checklist for Business Owners

• Go through the <u>Preliminary Application Checklist</u>, to see what items you will need to complete an application. This important info can be found on the Supplemental Documents tab on the SBA website.

#3 - Gather Your 2019 & 2020 Federal Tax Information

 You will need both your 2019 and 2020 (if completed) tax returns, business financial statements, your quarterly tax filings and all corporate documents, including articles of incorporation, partnership agreements, etc.

#4 - Get Your Business a DUNS Number

- The Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number is a unique nine-digit business identification number provided by Dun & Bradstreet (D&B) to businesses of any size.
- Acquiring a DUNS number is free and easy, and it's the first step to your SVOG application. Register <u>here!</u>
- Think you may already have a DUNS number? Call D&B using the toll-free number,
 1-866-705-5711, or check their <u>website</u> to find out.

#5 - Get Your Business a SAM Account

- The System for Award Management (SAM) is the federal government's grant registration system, and to apply for a Shuttered Venue Operators Grant, a SAM registration must be completed online.
- It's not quick and easy, but it is necessary prior to your application, and acceptance of your SAM registration can take several weeks, so we suggest getting it done ASAP.
- The SBDC recommends you review the SAM.gov website and look at the "Quick Start Guides for Grant Registrations" tab. We also created a <u>training video</u>
