



Math Placement for EOP/AIM Students

Signing Up for a Math Assessment

All new Stony Brook students must take a math assessment prior to their orientation date. New students sign up for the math assessment by selecting a date on the Advising Planning Form (APF) in the SOLAR system (www.stonybrook.edu/solarsystem). You will see check-boxes on the APF which say "EOP/AIM students check here." By checking those boxes, you will receive information on your confirmation page, similar to the information explained below.

The office of Student Orientation and Family Program has **reserved special math assessments for students entering the EOP/AIM program**. These assessments are offered **at our Manhattan Campus** (387 Park Avenue South, 3rd floor, New York, NY 10016; Students enter through the 101 East 27th St entrance). **If you live on Long Island**, or if you are unable to attend one of the dates below, you should not check the EOP/AIM box on the APF and simply select any open date before your orientation at either our main campus or Manhattan campus.

Specifically, math assessments for EOP/AIM students will be held on the following days/times:

- Monday, May 21, 2012 from 6-8 PM – Manhattan Campus (25 spaces)
- Tuesday, May 22, 2012 from 6-8 PM – Manhattan Campus (25 spaces)
- Wednesday, May 23, 2012 from 6-8 PM– Manhattan Campus (25 spaces)
- Thursday, May 24, 2012 from 6-8 PM– Manhattan Campus (85 spaces)

To sign up for an EOP/AIM math assessment, you must contact the office of Student Orientation and Family Programs **by May 18th at 12 noon** after you complete your APF. **Please identify yourself as an EOP/AIM student on the phone/email and be prepared to provide (1) your name, (2) your SBU ID, (3) your email address, and (4) your 1st and 2nd choices for the math assessment.** You can reach the Orientation office by calling 631-632-6710.

Preparing for Your Math Assessment

On the day of your math assessment, please arrive at least 10 minutes early. **You must bring photo ID and 1-2 pencils.** Scrap paper will be provided. You may not bring or use any calculators on the assessment. Please note that guests are not allowed to accompany students into the Manhattan campus, however there are waiting areas and restaurants at the ground level of the building for guests to wait for students.
