

## E-Journals

- ◆ Over 57,600 E-Journals available.
- ◆ If you know the title of the journal you are looking for, use the [E-Journals](#) link from the library homepage, then Find by Title to see which databases provide access to the journal.
- ◆ Be sure to check date ranges provided as date coverage varies by database.
- ◆ You may also Browse by Subject to see E-Journals relevant to your area of study.
- ◆ Use the [Citation Linker](#) link on the E-Journals page if you have the full citation for an article.

### RLG - Research Libraries Group

- ◆ Through Stony Brook's membership in the Research Libraries Group (RLG), individuals with a University ID card are allowed reference privileges, including access to library facilities and collections, at regional university libraries, including Columbia, Yale, Princeton, and New York Universities.

## Research Databases

- ◆ Access databases from the library homepage, [www.stonybrook.edu/library](http://www.stonybrook.edu/library), and clicking on the [Databases](#) link.
- ◆ Select by Subject using the drop down menu to see a list of relevant databases.
- ◆ Search by Title by selecting the first letter of the database title from the A-Z list.
- ◆ Many databases allow you to set up alerts by email or RSS feed in order to maintain current awareness on a topic. Alerts can be created for specific searches or for new issues of a journal. Check on the database's Help link for more specific information.

- ◆ Provides industry & investment reports, company profiles, fulltext journal articles and more.
- ◆ Includes information on parents & subsidiaries and associations by SIC or NAICS codes.

## Business Source<sup>®</sup> Complete

- ◆ Provides fulltext for more than 2,150 journals.
- ◆ Includes market research, industry and country reports, company profiles and SWOT analyses.



- ◆ Access to news articles. See News Page tab.
- ◆ Includes fulltext of *The Wall Street Journal*.
- ◆ Interactive chart feature allows for stock price comparisons over a given period.
- ◆ Limited number of seats available. Retry later if unavailable to get into database.



- ◆ Search for business information on companies, people, industries and news. Find current customers, competitors, market segments, SEC filings and more.
- ◆ Download company data into a spreadsheet or create a custom report.
- ◆ Email feed to keep current on company news.



- ◆ Stony Brook email address required to set up an account.
- ◆ Provides marketing information for consumer products.
- ◆ Includes information from Simmons Research, the National Consumer Survey (NCS), and the Teen Survey.
- ◆ Contains domestic and international data.
- ◆ Data can be downloaded into Excel.



- ◆ Click on Business tab.
- ◆ Provides fulltext news articles.
- ◆ Offers Company Financials Comparison feature, Company Profiles, Dossiers & Hierarchies, SEC filings, Legal & Intellectual Property Information, Country Profiles, etc.

## Google Scholar

- ◆ Provides a search of scholarly literature including theses, books, abstracts and articles.
- ◆ Available at [scholar.google.com/](http://scholar.google.com/).
- ◆ Click on the Scholar Preferences to include Stony Brook University and WorldCat under **Library Links**. This will allow you to access the fulltext of articles when available.
- ◆ **Note:** Google Scholar should not be used exclusively as many databases do not allow it to access their content.



## STARS, the Library Catalog

- ◆ Use [STARS](#), the library catalog, to find books, journals, DVDs, and music available at Stony Brook University or as part of the SUNY Shared Collection.
- ◆ Access the catalog from the Library Catalog link or the STARS logo on the library homepage.
- ◆ A variety of search options, including Keyword, Title, Author, etc., are available using the Basic Search.
- ◆ For additional search options, including Format, Date and Language, use the Advanced Search option.
- ◆ From the catalog, use the Sign-In link in the upper right corner and then click on the [My Account](#) link in red on the next page to access your account information and renew material online, up to three times.
- ◆ Use the New Books link on the top of the page to check for recent acquisitions in your field.
- ◆ The Journal Catalog link allows users to easily locate the library's print and electronic journals.
- ◆ Remember: Journal titles ARE available in STARS but individual articles ARE NOT. For articles, use the Databases link.



## Circulation Information

- ◆ Your Stony Brook ID card is also your library card.
- ◆ Graduate students and instructors can check out up to 98 books at one time and have them for the entire semester, except for materials from branch libraries which are available for 30 days.
- ◆ Materials can be renewed up to 3 times provided no one else has recalled the material. Materials can be renewed online through the library catalog, STARS.
- ◆ Fines are \$0.25 a day, \$85 a book. Borrowing privileges are suspended once fines reach \$5.
- ◆ Patrons may recall resources that are checked out to another patron. That patron then has two weeks to return the material or be subjected to additional fines. Recalls may be placed online using the library catalog.
