Applying to Stony Brook Southampton

Stony Brook Southampton strongly encourages you to apply online. The online application can be found at www.stonybrook.edu/southampton, or you may use this paper application.

This application is for out-of-state United States residents only; if you are a resident of New York State or an international student, please visit our Web site at www.stonybrook.edu/southampton or call (631) 632-5035 to obtain the appropriate application.

Freshman Applicants

• Regular Admission

Although there is no formal application deadline for Regular Admission, freshman applicants are advised to file their application for admission during the fall of their senior year.

• Early Action

Early Action is a non-binding application/notification program. Those who wish to apply for Early Action must submit

their application for admission by November 15 and supporting documentation (high school transcripts and SAT/ACT scores) by December 15.

Transfer Applicants

Although there is no formal application deadline for most programs, transfer applicants are encouraged to submit applications by March 1 for fall admission and by November 1 for spring admission.

International Applicants

For the purpose of applying for admission to Stony Brook Southampton, you are considered an international student if you wish to study in the U.S. under a student (F1) visa or hold an F1, F2, J1, or J2 visa. International students should visit www.stonybrook.edu/southampton to apply online or to obtain international paper application materials and instructions.

Reviewing Your Application

Applicants are evaluated on an individual basis with careful consideration given to a range of factors, including the rigor of their high school curriculum,

academic achievements, and personal strengths and talents. Successful freshman applicants will typically have:

- A high school diploma or equivalent (a Regents diploma is preferred for New York State residents).
- A strong high school academic program that includes four units of English, four units of social studies, three to four units of math, three to four units of science, and two or three units of a foreign language.
- Standardized test scores that indicate the promise of success in a rigorous undergraduate course of study. *Note:* Freshman applicants taking the ACT are required to submit the version with the optional writing section. SAT II scores in mathematics and a second

area of the student's choice are recommended.

- Students who show evidence of leadership, special talents or interests, and other personal qualities through extracurricular activities, volunteer work, and other nonacademic pursuits may receive special consideration.
- Two recommendations from counselors and teachers may be requested by Stony Brook Southampton's Admissions Office.

Admission Decisions

Applicants for the fall semester are notified of their admission beginning February 1 and on a rolling basis thereafter. Early Action applicants are notified of their admission by January 1.

Applicants for the spring semester are notified beginning November 1 and on a rolling basis thereafter.

Important Information Regarding E-mail

Stony Brook Southampton will be sending important admissions correspondence to the e-mail address you provide in your application. It is important that you provide us with a current e-mail address that you check frequently.

Please include joinsouthampton@stonybrook.edu in your address book and/or remove any spam blockers that might prevent our e-mail from reaching you.

If you **do not** receive an e-mail from Stony Brook Southampton's Office of Undergraduate Admissions within three weeks of submitting your application for admission, send an e-mail to joinsouthampton@stonybrook.edu from the e-mail address to which you would like correspondence sent. The e-mail should include the subject line "Applicant E-mail Address," and state your full name and date of birth in the body.

Report Your SAT/ACT Scores

Freshman applicants and transfers with fewer than 24 college credits are required to have SAT scores and/or ACT scores reported to Stony Brook Southampton. You can request to have your SAT scores reported online through College Board at www.collegeboard.com (Stony Brook's College Board code is 2548).

ACT scores can be reported online by visiting the ACT Web site at www.actstudent.org (Stony Brook's ACT code is 2952). Those taking the ACT are required to submit the version with the optional writing section.

Step 1

Choose a Major

You may select a specific program of study or indicate that you do not wish to select one at this time by choosing curriculum code 0000 (undeclared major).

Step 2

Complete the Application

Instructions for specific questions on the application are provided on pages 2 and 3 with numbers corresponding to the number of the question on the application. Please read carefully and follow all directions.

9a–9b Residency

These questions concern your residency for tuition purposes. Generally, individuals who have maintained their domicile in another state or in New York for a period of less than 12 months prior to the end of registration are presumed to be out-of-state residents and are not eligible for the resident tuition rate. Individuals do not meet the 12-month residency requirement if domiciled in New York State for the sole purpose of attending college. Individuals who are

financially dependent and whose custodial parent(s) live in a state other than New York are generally not eligible for the resident tuition rate.

International students and those who expect to be considered New York State residents should not use this application. Students are generally considered New York State residents if they have established their domicile in New York State for at least 12 months prior to the last day of the registration period.

Dependent students of divorced or legally separated parents may acquire a New York State domicile if the custodial parent is a New York State resident or if the student resides with a non-custodial parent who is a New York State resident and the student intends to continue to reside with that parent throughout their attendance at Stony Brook Southampton.

Generally, only U.S. citizens (question 7) and permanent residents are eligible for the New York State tuition rate. However, certain non-U.S. citizens who graduate from a New York high school and meet other requirements may qualify for the resident tuition rate.

19a–19b Felony/Dismissal Information (REQUIRED FOR ALL APPLICANTS) Even if you have never attended college, a response is required.

A felony in N.Y. State law is defined as a crime for which more than one year in prison may be imposed. The felony question applies if you have been convicted as an adult. If you have been adjudicated as having juvenile delinquent or youthful offender status, you are required to respond to the felony question 19a by indicating a response of no.

Suspension is defined as a sanction imposed for disciplinary reasons that results in a student leaving school for a fixed time period, less than permanently.

Dismissal from a college for disciplinary reasons is defined as permanent separation from an institution of higher education on the basis of conduct or behavior.

An affirmative response to either question will not automatically prevent admission, but you will be asked by your college choices to provide additional information. This information will be reviewed by a campus committee to ensure campus safety. Any falsification or omission of data may result in a denial of admission or dismissal.

Early Action

Early Action is a non-binding early application/notification program for fall freshmen. If you are accepted for Early Action, you need not withdraw your applications at other institutions. Indicate your desire to apply for Early Action where indicated.

To apply for Early Action, an online application must be submitted on or before November 15. A paper application must be postmarked by November 15. Applications must be complete by December 15. If your application is complete by December 15, we will notify you of our decision by January 1.

Step 3

Include Application Fee

The \$40 application fee MUST be included. Make checks payable to Stony Brook Southampton/Account #900510. Checks must be in U.S. dollars and drawn on a U.S. bank. Failure to include payment may delay processing. **This fee is non-refundable.**

The application fee is for processing services; it is non-refundable and independent of an admission decision or a decision to withdraw or decline an offer of acceptance. When you submit an application, you assume responsibility for prompt payment of all fees due.

Returned checks will be subject to an additional processing fee of \$10.

All appeals for refunds must be put in writing to the Dean of Admissions at Stony Brook Southampton.

Step 4

Request Transcripts

If you are applying to Stony Brook University as a freshman, please send one transcript along with your completed application and application fee. If your transcripts are not available at the time you submit your application, or if you apply online, please have your transcripts forwarded as soon as possible.

If you are applying to Stony Brook Southampton as a transfer student, please note that academic transcripts are required for **all** colleges you attended, whether or not you received credit.

If you are transferring from another SUNY school, please

request a General Education Transcript Addendum be sent with your official transcript.

Transfer applicants earning less than the equivalent of one year of study (generally 24–30 credit hours), should arrange for their former high school to send transcripts directly to Stony Brook Southampton.

Information for School Counselors and College Advisors

Complete the academic information requested on page A4 of the application, along with your signature. Please enter only one rank and academic average and provide transcripts. All four pages of the application should be mailed together.

Applications will not be processed until full payment or authorized fee waiver is received.

Costs and Financial Aid Information

How Financial Aid Works

Tuition and fees at Stony Brook University are already low compared to other colleges and universities. However, financial aid is available for students who are unable to pay college costs. The table below shows the approximate cost to attend Stony Brook Southampton for one academic year. Based on state and federal criteria, Stony Brook's Financial Aid Office will determine your eligibility for assistance. Students themselves and their families are considered the first source of funding to meet college costs. The financial aid process uses a standard method to determine how much a family should contribute to a student's education.

Types of Financial Aid

Financial aid programs include academic scholarships, need-based grants, student and parent loans, and employment. Both the federal and state government offer financial aid opportunities. In addition, other sources of assistance may include scholarships from private

organizations, foundations, fraternal groups, and SUNY campus sources.

Tuition, Fees, and Other Costs

Total costs vary depending on full-time or part-time enrollment, program of study, housing accommodations, meal plan, personal expenses, and other individual factors. Stony Brook Southampton has higher tuition rates for students who are not New York State residents (see chart below). Contact the Student Accounts Office for details about residency requirements.

For students taking fewer than 12 semester hours (part-time study), New York State resident tuition is \$181 per credit hour for baccalaureate degree programs.

Time Option Payment Plan

Stony Brook offers the Time Option Payment Plan (TOPP) which allows students and parents to make equal and consecutive payments throughout the semester rather than paying the balance of the bill up front. Enrollment forms for TOPP

will be sent with the student's first bill. For more information, please contact the Student Accounts Office at (631) 632-BILL.

How New Students Apply for Financial Aid

1. All students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

- If you have Internet access, you can file the FAFSA online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Use Stony Brook's Federal School Code is 002838.
- Complete the FAFSA after January 1, 2008, even if you have not yet filed your 2007 tax returns. Use estimates if necessary.
- If you are unable to file online, you can obtain the FAFSA application from your high school counseling office. Be sure to meet all deadlines.

2. Investigate other sources of aid. Several free scholarship search services are available online.

3. Keep a file of records and copies of applications.

4. Visit the Office of Financial Aid's Web site at www.stonybrook.edu/financialaid or contact the office if you have specific questions.

How Transfer Students Apply for Financial Aid

1. If you did not submit a FAFSA for the current academic year (2007-08), you should follow the application instructions for new students.

2. If you did apply for financial aid for the current year (2007-08), you can complete the Renewal FAFSA on the Web at www.fafsa.ed.gov

3. To apply for financial aid at the college you are transferring to, use the college code for the new campus on the Renewal FAFSA. You can get the code from the college, or by calling (800) 4FEDAID, or online at www.fafsa.ed.gov
