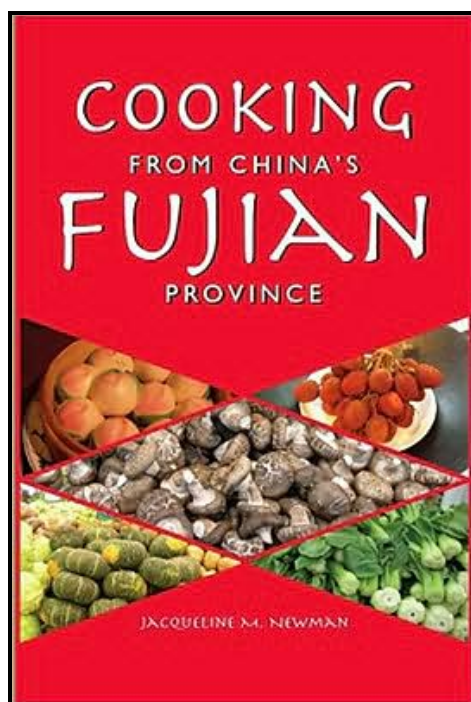


Cooking from China's Fujian Province
