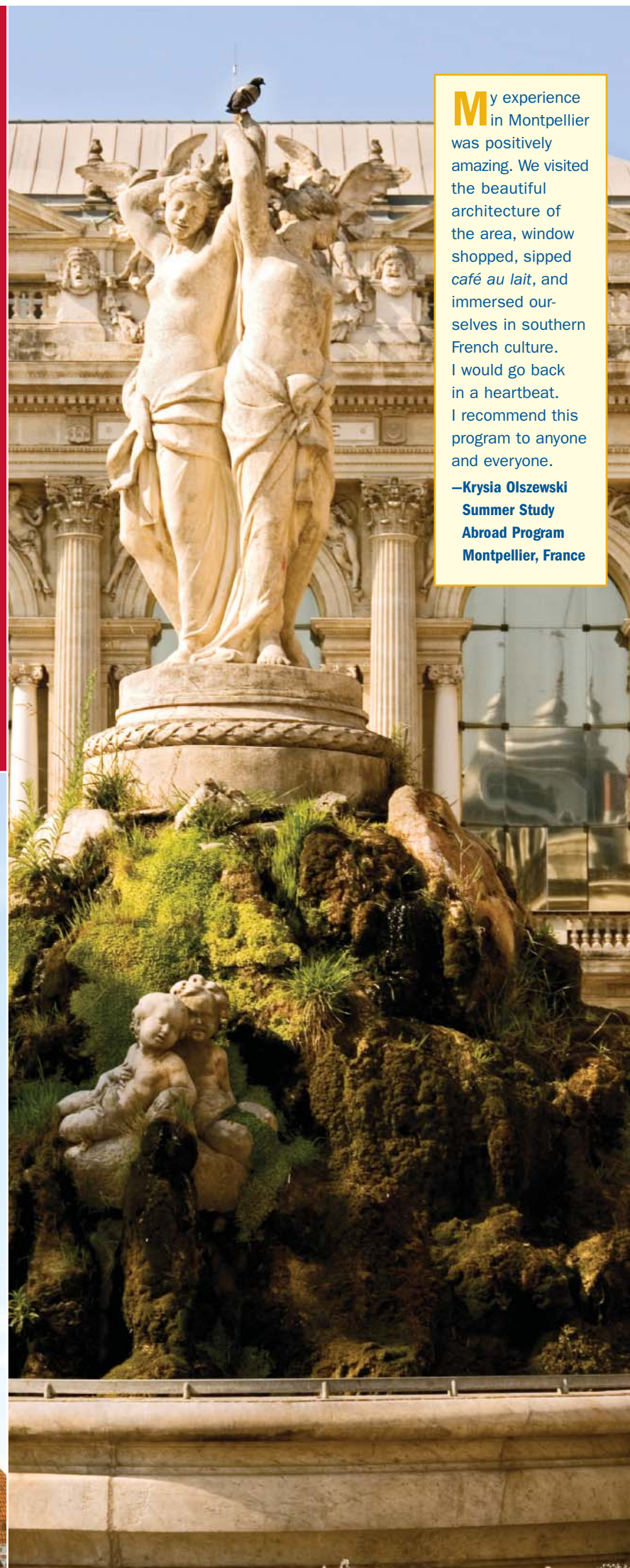


Florence University of the Arts

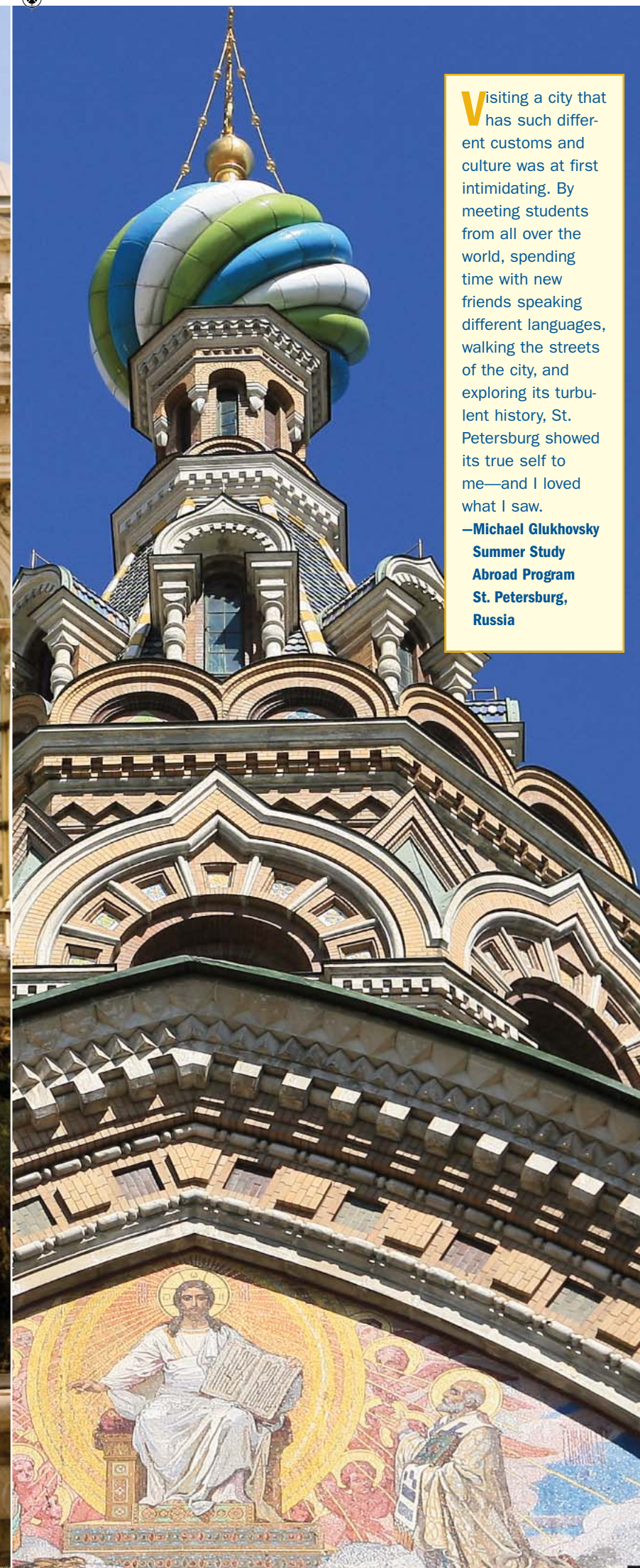

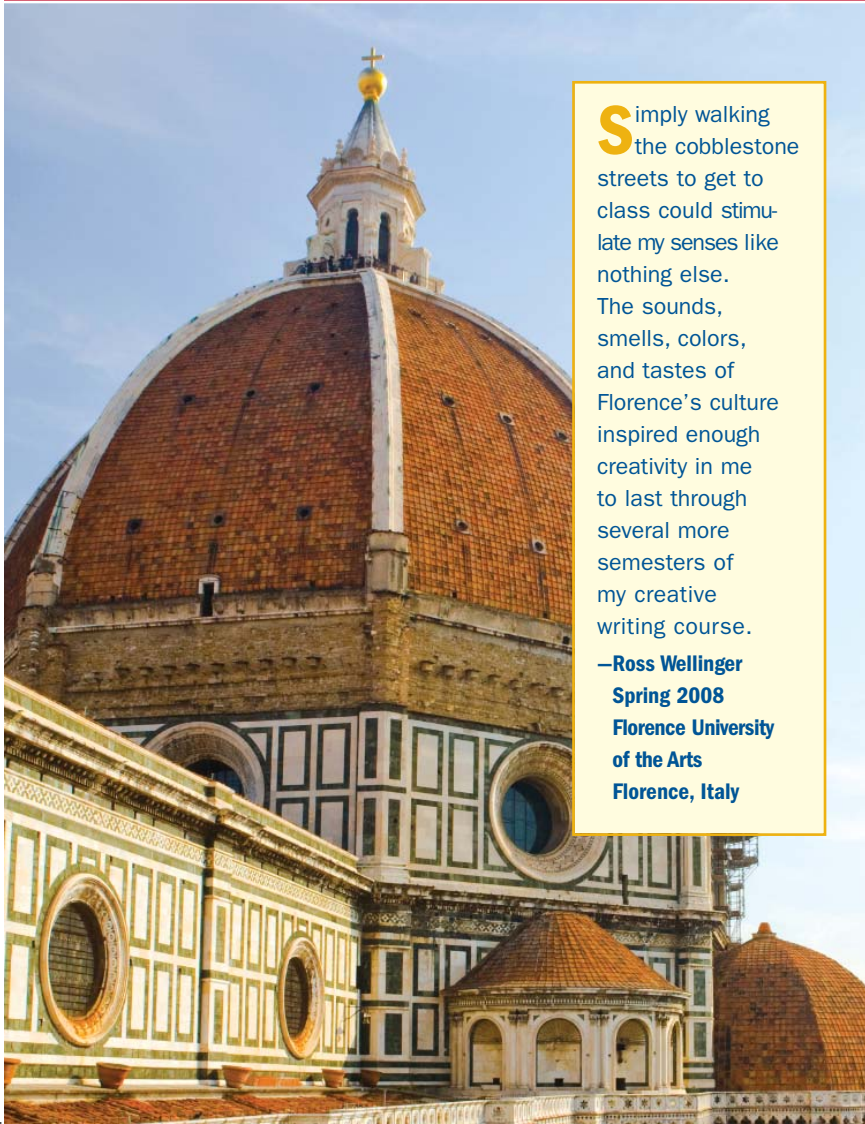

Study Abroad and Exchange at Stony Brook University

An international academic experience is now a necessity for students who want to remain competitive for employment or professional/graduate study. The Office of International Academic Programs and Services provides a variety of exciting opportunities for students seeking to enhance their undergraduate experience. These programs are divided into two categories:

Study Abroad/Short-Term Programs

- All instruction in English
- Faculty-led group experience or intersession at select partner universities
- Typically scheduled during Summer or Winter sessions

International Exchange/Long-Term Programs

- Students may take courses in English
- Direct enrollment at one of Stony Brook University's partner universities
- One semester or an academic year

Study Abroad/Short-Term Programs

AFRICA

- Madagascar (Summer or Fall)**
- Six to nine credits (Summer) or 12 to 15 credits (Fall) of Anthropology and Biology
 - Field research in a wildlife preserve

Kenya (Spring)

- Fifteen credits of physical anthropology and geology
- Turkana Basin field school

Tanzania (Summer)

- Six to nine Anthropology credits
- Includes a stay in an African American cultural center, a city, a rural community, and a safari to national parks

ASIA

Fabled Silk Road, China (Summer)

- Six Journalism credits

Shanghai/Beijing, China (Summer)

- Six to nine credits of Asian and Asian American Studies and Chinese language
- Three weeks in Shanghai and a three-day tour of Beijing

Hong Kong (Summer)

- International Summer School at the Chinese University of Hong Kong

- International Summer School at one of several partner universities

- Six to nine credits of Japanese language and Asian and Asian American Studies

Frequently Asked Questions About Studying Overseas

How can I make my international experience affordable?

The Office of International Academic Programs and Services works closely with the Office of Student Financial Aid Services to help Stony Brook students make their overseas experience affordable. In most cases, a student's existing financial aid may be applied to the cost of a Short-Term Study Abroad Program or a Long-Term International Exchange.

Are foreign language skills required?

All Short-Term Study Abroad Programs are taught in English; however, in many cases, students have the option of taking language courses. English is the primary language of instruction at many of Stony Brook University's long-term exchange partner institutions.

How does the coursework apply to my academic plan?

International Academic Programs and Services offers something for every student. Depending on the program, students may earn Diversified Education Curriculum (DEC), major/minor, or upper-division credits.

Which program is most appropriate for my major?

There is not necessarily a linear relationship between one's major and one's choice of overseas program. One of our advisors can help determine which opportunity best fits a student's academic goals.

What are the benefits to studying overseas?

Only 5 percent of American undergraduates study overseas. By participating in one of our programs, students become a part of this elite minority prepared for the challenges of the 21st century.

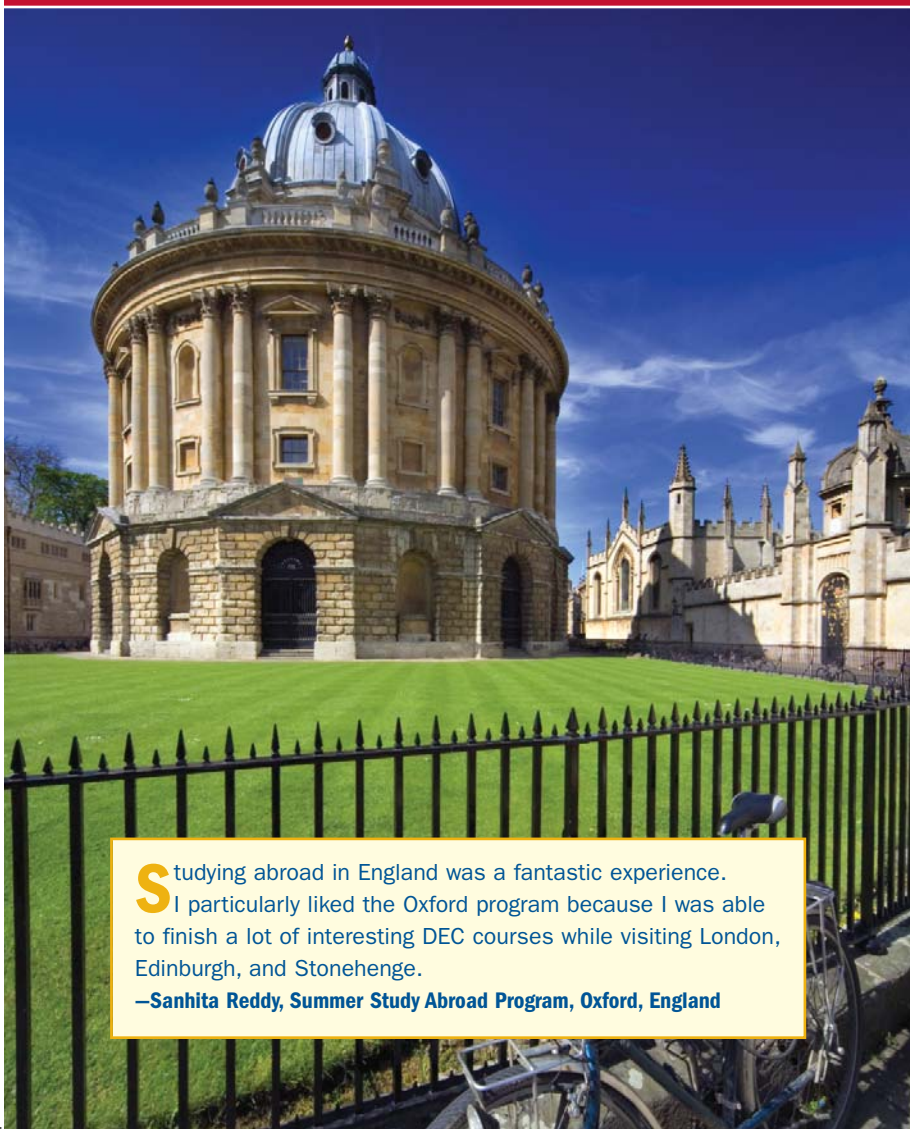
