



ASHLEY SCHIFF PARK PRESERVE SCHOLARSHIP

Stony Brook University

Dr. Ashley Schiff was a dedicated and popular Associate Professor of Political Science and an avowed naturalist in the early days of Stony Brook University. In the fall of 1969, he died suddenly and unexpectedly at the age of 37. A 26-acre woodland located on campus, lined with oak and maple trees, was dedicated in his memory by the former U.S. Interior Secretary Stewart Udall and SUNY Stony Brook President John S. Toll in 1970.

A rich variety of plants and animals can be found in the forest. A number of these plants are vulnerable native species under threat from development in many parts of the state. Animals such as garter snakes, Virginia opossums, and box turtles are known to live there. The Ashley Schiff Park Preserve Scholarship (ASPPS) recognizes Stony Brook University undergraduate and graduate students of outstanding academic ability who demonstrate a commitment to environmental preservation through academic studies or research projects using the Ashley Schiff Park Preserve. This scholarship (up to \$1,000 awarded annually) was established in 2006 by the Friends of the Ashley Schiff Park Preserve through a generous donation by Avalon Park & Preserve, Inc. to honor the memory of Dr. Ashley Schiff.

Scholarship Qualifications for Applicants

- A. Must be a full-time Stony Brook student the year the scholarship is in effect.
- B. Must be a Junior, Senior, or Graduate student demonstrating a commitment to environmental preservation through research using the Ashley Schiff Preserve.
- C. Must have a minimum 3.0 GPA.
- D. Must demonstrate leadership, potential, and promise.

In addition, the ASPPS Selection Committee seeks applicants that demonstrate:

- a passion and capacity to exercise leadership and respond to social and environmental challenges;
- a commitment to the values of diversity and justice within the environmental field;
- the desire to remain an active member of the Friends of Ashley Schiff Park Preserve (FASPP) after the conclusion of their education at Stony Brook University.

Scholarship Selection

- A. The application deadline for the Ashley Schiff Preserve Scholarship is July 1.
- B. Selection will be made by a subcommittee of Interim Trustees and the student(s) will be notified by Mary Woodward.
