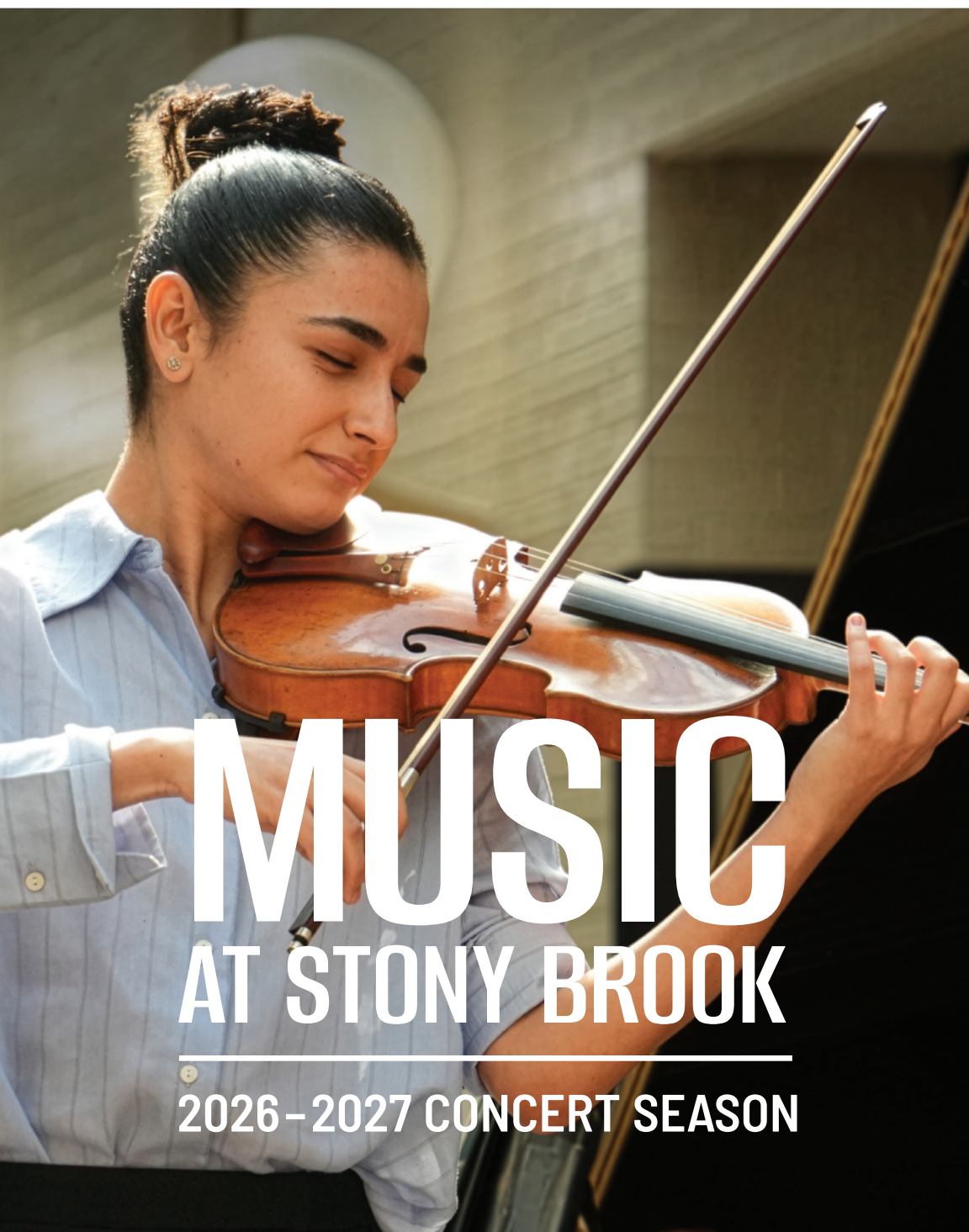

CHAMBER MUSIC

Graduate students perform chamber works of all genres, stylistic periods and instrumentations, old and new. The performances draw from rigorous chamber courses, including Christina Dahl's duo seminar, Gilbert Kalish's trio seminar and the Emerson String Quartet Institute (ESQI). The ESQI provides training for student string quartets, which receive regular coaching from members of the Emerson Quartet. Additional chamber music concerts in the community will be added during the year. JAZZ

Come hear Stony Brook University's famed jazz ensembles, under the leadership of Roxy Coss, the newly appointed director of Jazz Studies. Coss is a saxophonist, Grammy award-winning musician, composer, educator and activist. The Stony Brook University Jazz Orchestra, Graduate Jazz Ensemble and Undergraduate Jazz Combos all perform works spanning the history of jazz, from the 1920s through today. Each group performs unique arrangements of repertoire, including timeless classics, modern standards and original compositions from the band members. These three ensembles showcase the incredible sounds of large- and small-ensemble jazz music while featuring Stony Brook's brightest improvisers and soloists. Many of the university's jazz events take place at the local jazz museum and venue, The Jazz Loft, located in downtown Stony Brook Village; the remainder of the concerts take place in Stony Brook University's Recital Hall.
