### CONFIDENTIAL RESOURCE AND SUPPORT SERVICES

CONFIDENTIAL support and resource options are available to students, faculty and staff who experience sexual violence. If you choose to report, Samantha can assist survivors with all steps of Stony Brook's investigation/review process and University Police investigation. Crisis support/emergency response is provided 24/7.

### CONFIDENTIAL MEDICAL SERVICES

#### **WITHIN 96 Hours (Four Days) of Incident**

#### **Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) Center at Stony Brook University Hospital (SBUH)**

You may request a free medical and forensic exam at the SBUH emergency room. Our nurse is trained to obtain evidence should you decide to report the incident to police and/or press charges later. VIBS will provide a rape crisis counselor. SANE services are open to any gender at NO COST. Your parents will NOT be notified. **Our University Police will transport you to the SANE Center without requiring you to make a police report.**
