Options for final 6 credits:

Option 1:

A Capstone Experience in the form of an internship or a thesis. Students interested in this Capstone Experience option are required to take POL 596: Capstone Preparation Seminar (1 credit/online) in the semester prior to starting the Capstone Experience.

Option 2:
