



HOW TO APPLY AS A TRANSFER STUDENT

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Apply with SUNY Application or Common App
- \$50 application fee
- Official transcript from all colleges attended after high school
- Final high school transcript if you have completed fewer than 24 college credits earned after high school at the time of application

ADMISSION CRITERIA

- 2.8 cumulative GPA at the time of application (restricted majors may require a higher GPA and specific prerequisite courses)
- Prerequisite courses are required for students applying to the College of Engineering, College of Business, Nursing, Social Work, Clinical Lab Sciences, and Respiratory Care

TRANSFERRING CREDIT

- A maximum of 84 credits with grades of C or better for most majors may be transferred from a regionally accredited college or university (a typical degree requires 120 credits)
- An official credit evaluation is completed after students are accepted and pay a tuition deposit

PRIORITY APPLICATION DEADLINES

Fall semester

May 1*

Spring semester

November 1*

*Applications received after these dates will be considered on a space-available basis. Applicants interested in restricted majors are encouraged to apply earlier than the posted deadlines. See reverse for a list of restricted majors.
